

## **SEND Parent Questionnaire Results – February 2018**

- 72% of parents responded to the questionnaire.
- 100% of respondents clearly understood why their children had a School Support Plan.
- 100% of respondents knew that their child's School Support Plan was reviewed every term.
- 100% of respondents knew that Mrs Cross was the SENCO.
- 70% of respondents knew that Mrs Stancliffe was the governor with responsibility for SEND.
- 100% of respondents felt that they were given the opportunity to meet to discuss their child's progress.
- 100% of respondents felt that the contents of the School Support Plan were clearly explained at meetings.
- 100% of respondents felt their child's targets were reasonable and achievable.
- 100% of respondents understood how their child was being supported in school.
- 100% of respondents felt that they were kept up to date with their child's progress and education.
- 100% of respondents felt that they were given advice and suggestions for how they could help their child at home.
- 100% of respondents felt that their views and opinions were valued by the school.
- 100% of respondents felt that their child's views were valued (when age appropriate).
- 100% of respondents felt comfortable approaching the SENCO with any queries or concerns.
- 100% of respondents felt that the school supports their child to reach their potential.
- 100% of respondents did not have any suggestions for improvements.
- 100% of respondents felt that they have sufficient meetings and information.
- 70% of respondents were aware of the Local Offer.
